"We hope this collaboration can be expanded to other academic areas, such as guest lectures, joint research, and community service, to have a broader impact on the academic community and society," said Musa.

The signing ceremony of the PKS was attended by several important figures, including Prof. Rhenald Kasali, founder of Rumah Perubahan, and Fauziah Hanifah, Regional Coordinator of DEEP Indonesia West Java. Also present from the Faculty of Social and Political Sciences (FISIP) of UPNVJ were Restu Rahmawati, S.Sos., M.Sos. (Coordinator of the Political Science Study Program), Ayu Wardani, SIKom., MA (Lecturer in the Communication Science Study Program), as well as the collaboration and media team of FISIP UPNVJ.
